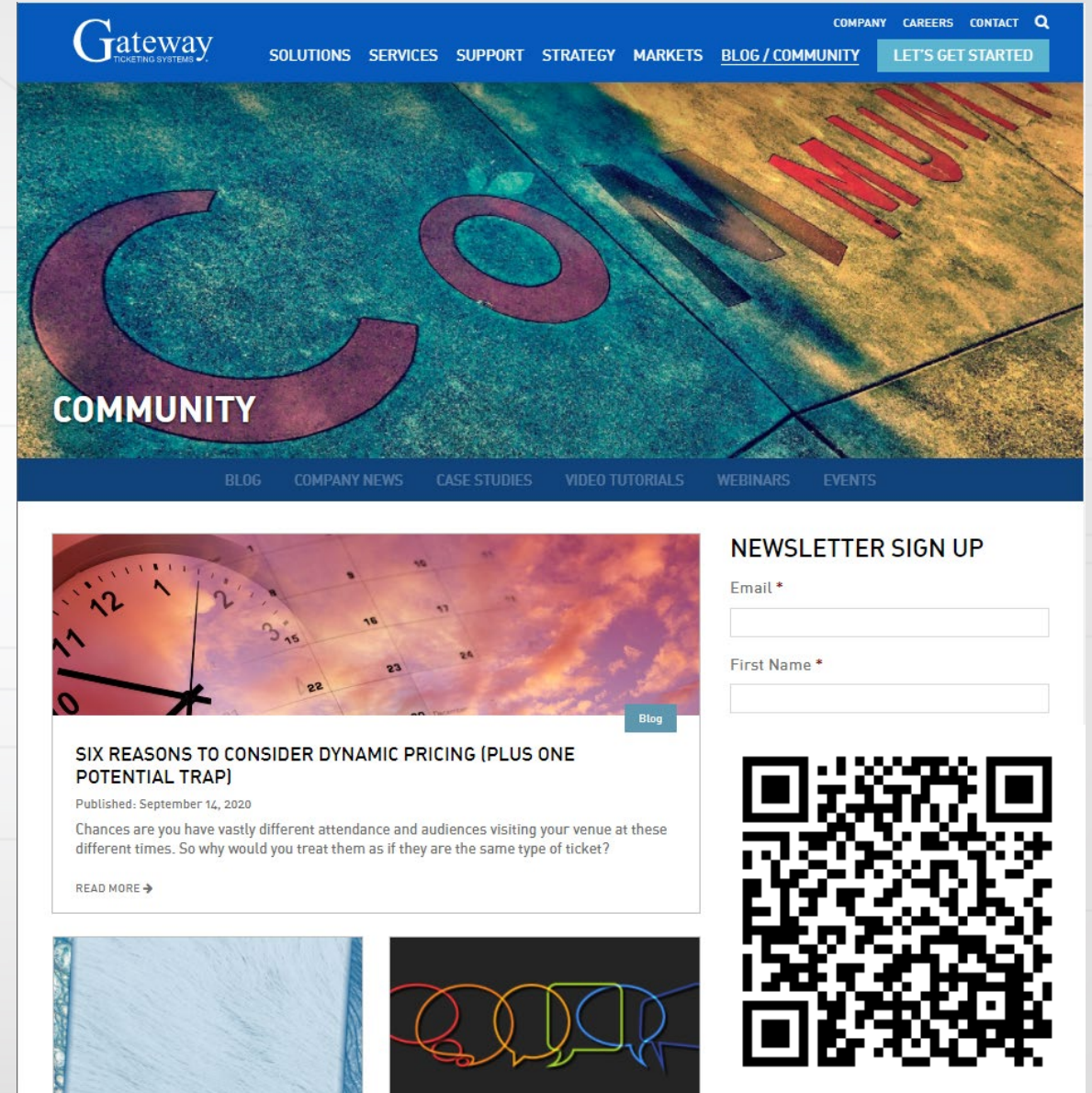

Disney World reopens with new safety measures amid COVID concerns
As Walt Disney World reopens, here are some new health and safety measures you may see. USA TODAY

According to Eddie Sotto, the only people wearing masks at theme parks should be the actors playing anthropomorphic rodents, ducks, dogs, and assorted other characters. Yes, he knows there is a pandemic raging. No, he's not some anti-mask crusader.

Sotto spent 13 years as a Walt Disney Imagineer, the term that the company uses to describe its army of designers, writers, engineers and other creative and technical professionals who create its theme park experiences. During that time, he had a hand in developing some landmark attractions including the Indiana Jones Adventure at Disneyland in California and the industry's first trackless indoor dark ride, Pooh's Hunny Hunt at Tokyo Disneyland.

"You can't treat people like they are in a hospital," Sotto says, referring to the attempts to keep people safely apart at what are inherently social spaces and the practices that disconnect visitors from theme park magic. "It's a death spiral for the industry."

Sotto's radical solution? Only allow visitors through the turnstiles who have been cleared of infection. Then let them scream to their hearts' content aboard roller coasters and party like it's (pre-pandemic) 2019. No masks. No distancing.

Drive-thru tours bolster financially troubled San Antonio Zoo

When officials announced the Drive-Thru Zoo in late April, tickets for the first tours sold out in 90 minutes, said Tim Morrow, the zoo's president and CEO. Since then, the tours have brought in **more than \$1 million** in revenue.

On May 1, **opening day, 893 vehicles** drove through the zoo, pausing to watch the bears, giraffes and other inhabitants. At that point, the zoo had been closed for six weeks because of stay-at-home orders aimed at stopping the spread of the coronavirus.

The 106-year-old zoo was in deep financial trouble, and it **furloughed 400** of its 700 workers. The animals' only visitors were their caretakers.

But nearly **21,000 families** toured the zoo in their vehicles **in May**, paying entrance fees of as much as **\$65**. The tours' success allowed the zoo to bring back all the furloughed employees.

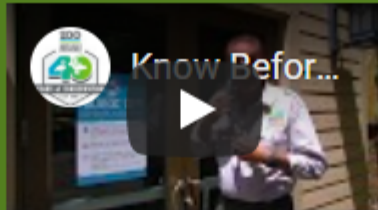


MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, Fla. – Zoo Miami reopened to visitors Tuesday after being forced to re-close its doors on the Fourth of July.

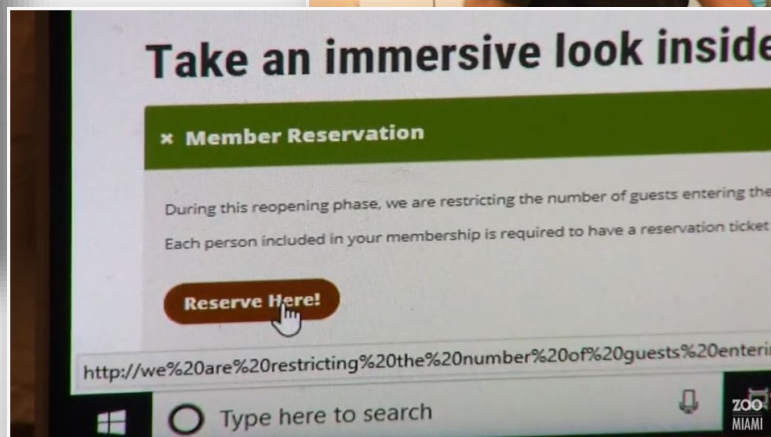

San Diego Zoo Global Shifts Conservation Focus

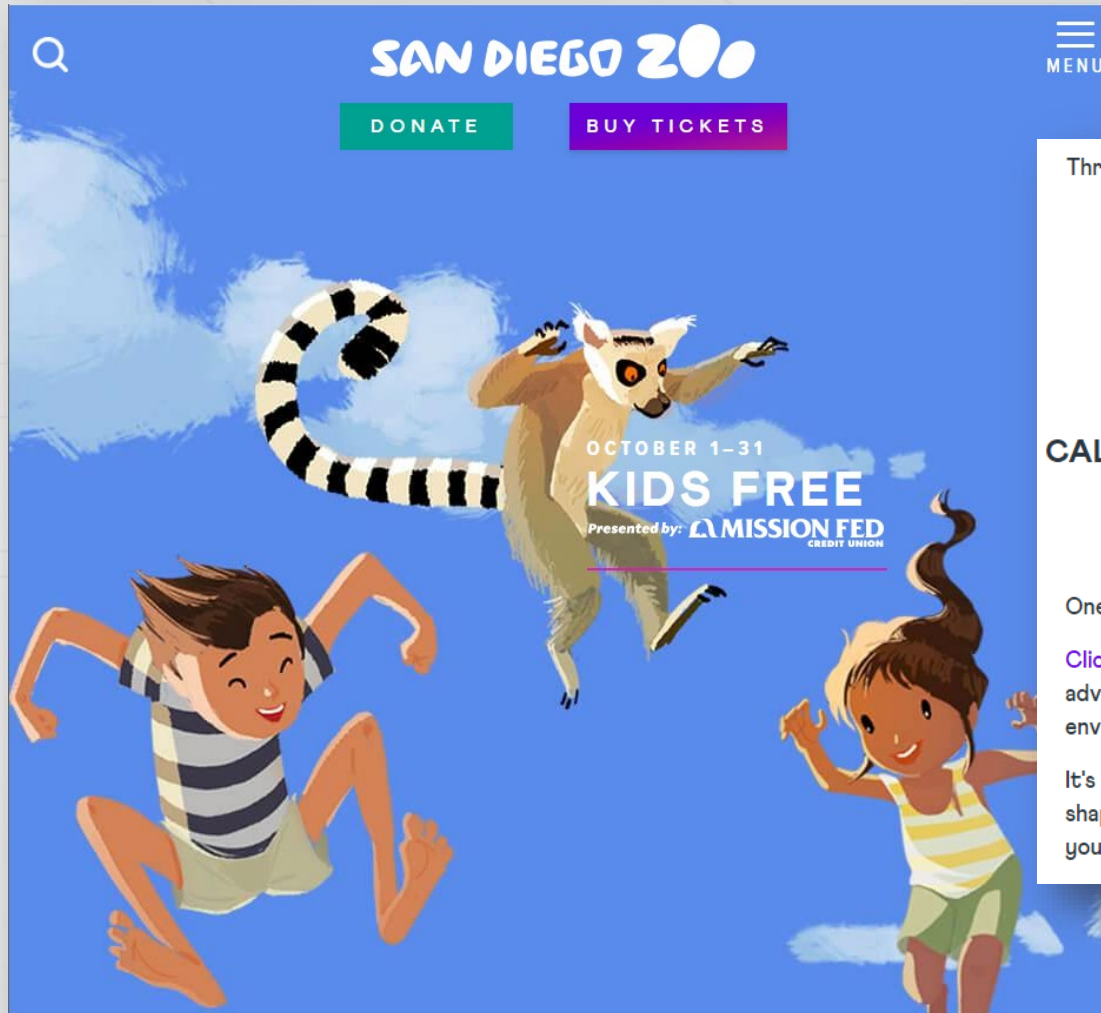

San Diego Zoo Global — the nonprofit that operates all zoo parks and organization — is shifting the focus of its conservation efforts to take a more holistic approach to help threatened species.

The concept is playing out at the San Diego Zoo Safari Park, where on a recent morning, the park's herd of nine African elephants sought out shade ahead of the midday heat.



Throughout October, children 11 years and younger receive free admission—no ticket is required when accompanied by an adult with a valid form of admission.

REOPENING FAQ

WHAT'S DIFFERENT AT THE ZOO AND SAFARI PARK?

Do I need to wear a cloth facial covering to visit?

Yes. Per mandate from San Diego County and the California Department of Public Health, ALL Zoo team members and guests ages two and older will be required to wear cloth facial coverings—without holes or vents—that cover the nose and mouth for the duration of their visits (except while dining). What are the operating hours of the Zoo and Safari Park?

Check here for current [Zoo hours](#) and current [Safari Park hours](#). Entrance is subject to temporary daily on-grounds attendance limits.

Will parking be restricted?

During our initial reopening, Zoo parking will be limited. At the Safari Park, beginning Saturday, June 27, general parking is \$15 per vehicle and \$20 for RV parking. Preferred parking is temporarily unavailable.

Are there limits to the numbers of visitors allowed into the Zoo and Safari Park each day?

Yes. For the safety of our guests and team members, and to comply with mandated social distancing requirements, we limit the number of guests. Entry to our parks will be on a first-come, first-served basis until we reach our daily reduced on-grounds attendance limit. Once the on-grounds attendance limit is reached, as guests exit the parks, waiting guests will be admitted.

How will guests be admitted each day?

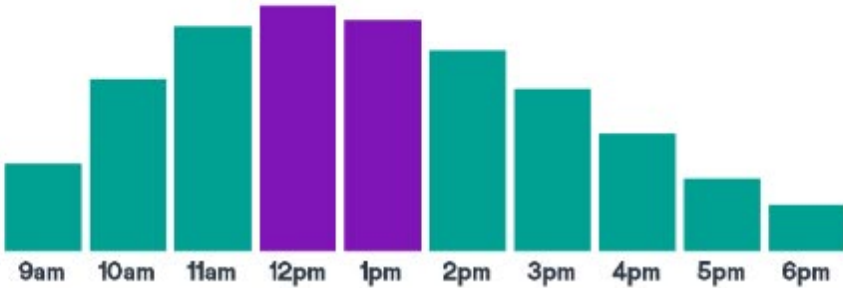
All guests must show valid tickets or valid membership cards, along with a picture ID, to be admitted on a first-come, first-served basis until the daily on-grounds attendance limit is reached. Then, as guests exit the parks, waiting guests will be admitted.
